WELCOME TO THE REVOLUTION ROAD

The Revolution Road driving tour takes you on a journey through history along the Revolution Road. This east-west route across West Florida was used during the Revolutionary War. In celebration of America's 250th anniversary, interpretive panels have been placed at key locations throughout Washington County describing the historic events of the time.

Old City Hall - Official Tour Start



Start your tour here! Explore the Old City Hall built in 1929 and the Little Library which started out as a potato shed for the L&N Railroad in the 1800's.

Chipley Train Depot



Visit the George Washington statue, the county's namesake, and explore the history of the first President of the United States of America.

Orange Hill Park - 1778 British Campsite near Orange Hill



A party of British officers and mapmaker Joseph Purcell camped near this spot in 1778. They were in route from Pensacola to St. Augustine during the American Revolution.

Orange Hill Missionary Baptist Church - The British at Orange Hill



Orange Hill is a unique geological formation that has been an important landmark for hundreds of years. The British expedition crossed over it on September 30, 1778.

REVOLUTION ROAD



Hard Labor Creek Church - Hard Labor Creek Crossing in 1778



British forces crossed the creek here on September 30, 1778, near the site of the earlier Spanish settlement of Mission San Carlos.

Porter Lake - Porter Lake in 1778



British mapmaker Joseph Purcell drew the first known representation of the stunning Porter Lake in 1778. He passed the lake while traveling with the British returning from Pensacola.

Williford Spring Recreation Area - Natural Bridge of Econfina Creek



This road is an original part of the trail known as the "Path to the Forks" during the American Revolution. It crossed Econfina Creek just east of here.

Ebro Community Center - British Camp of September 30, 1778



The British camped near today's Ebro on the night of September 30, 1778, probably just across the Bay County line at Court Martial Lake.

Vernon Wayside Park - Holmes Creek in 1778



During the American Revolution, the name Weeki Wachee applied to what we know today as Holmes Creek. The name is from the Muskogee language. It was well known to the British.

Burnt Sock Landing - The Creek Town of Little Ockchoyce



The Native American inhabitants of Little Ockchoyce, a town on Holmes Creek, allied with the British during the American Revolution.

Blue Lake Park - Daniel Boone's Long Walk



The noted frontiersman Daniel Boone, who fought for independence during the American Revolution made his little known walk across Florida in 1764.
